May 18th Kathy Edwards, Watercolor Beach Scene.

MATERAILS SUPPLIED: water color paper, water color paint, and pattern.

Bring: watercolor paint, your watercolor pallet, medium size rounds and 1" flat, water proof board, tape, water bucket, paper towels, black Micro pen #5. graphite transfer paper.

Colors I used: for the sky: Cobalt Blue or Cerulean: House can be any color you want (I used turquoises) Door and shutters are orange: Palm trees, raw sienna, cobalt blue, sap green, lemon yellow: red: Roosters: green, red, blue: shadows purple. I will have tubes of these paint colors for you to use.



Vicki Arndts remembered a class I taught several years ago using instant tea, blue and black and wanted to do it again so; for anyone who would like to try this out I will teach it again after lunch and will furnish the paper and tea.



June 15th Kathy Swigon: is teaching a patriotic design in honor of Flag Day.

The June meeting project is American Zen Eagle designed by Sharon Bond. She is donating the line drawing and base coat instructions to us. It's painted with DecoArt acrylics and finished with Zentangle style details. I will have a limited number of parchment paper surfaces available at the May meeting with the pattern applied for \$1 ea. Or you may use the surfaces of your choice. I did a sample on a tin wall pocket with a dark blue background as well as the parchment paper. I used JoSonja Harbor Blue but DecoArt Ultramarine, Midnight, Deep Midnight or Navy Blue would work well. Line drawings and paint base coat instructions are in the newsletter DecoArt colors: Black, Payne's Grey, Midnight Blue, Winter Blue, Snow White, Warm White, Bleached Sand, Buttermilk, Cashmere Beigh, Spicy Mustard or Marigolds, Burnt Sienna, Tomato or other red (optional).



Other supplies: Black fine tip permanent marker—Sharpie or Ident pen, star stencil, assorted sizes, eraser, graphite paper white or grey depending on background, other usual acrylic supplies

Brushes: #3 round, 3/4" flat for base coating, #6 filbert, #1 short liner, 3/8" angle, small stencil brush Visit Sharon's Etsy shop for more designs. https://www.etsy.com/shop/skb007

Simply looking at art – anything from the photo on your wall calendar to the mural you pass on your morning drive-can boost happiness, say researchers in the journal Cognition and Emotion. Tips and Tricks: Michelle Shroyer

Battery Stirrer



Michelle found this battery operated Mini stirrer on Amazon. Michelle said this comes in handy when your bottle of paint gets to thick to us. Add some water to the bottle, insert the stirrer, mixt t he water and paint until it is the right consistency. To clean the stirrer: use a plastic cup with a lid. Insert the stirrer through the hole in the top, making sure the top in on tight, turn on the stirrer until clean.

How to make caulk lace.

Supplies and tools: Silicon lace mold for cake decorating (available on Amazon, in the cake decorating isle at Michaels, JoAnn's and Hobby Lobby), bench scraper for cakes on Amazon or Bondo scraper at Walmart, caulking DAP INC white Alex Plus Acrylic Latex Caulk fast dry (be sure it has a cap) on Amazon or at Walmart, corn starch at the grocery store, fluffy brush (I used a make up brush), and baby wipes or damp (not wet) paper towels

(If you want to make some for cakes use edible lace mix on Amazon.)

(Do not use mats for both cakes and caulking.)

Brush corn starch on mold, spread the caulk on mold, pushing it into the mold with scraper, (watch for bubbles an dips that need more caulk), wipe haze (the excess outside of the mold areas) off with Baby wipes (don't mess up the caulk), Set aside and let dry 8 to 10 to hours.

Once dry: To unmold, brush the caulk design with corn starch (to keep it from sticking to itself). Turn the mold so the calking side is on the table, then curl the edge of the mold back, gently peel the lace caulk from the mold.

You can cut the lace caulk to size you want, glue to your surface, and/or paint it.
